Anthony Olubunmi Akinbola is a first-generation American raised between Missouri and Nigeria.

Anthony Olubunmi Akinbola's practice carries a multifaceted approach to medium and composition, wherein he combines and contrasts varying elements of color to explore the intricacies of identity. By incorporating totemic materials, such as palm oil, hairbrushes, and durags - a garment used in the maintenance of African hair - Akinbola delves into concerns of consumption and commodification of Black culture. Upon closer examination of their historical and cultural significance, his works highlight these ready-mades as embedded within a greater narrative of the complex relationship between Africa and Black America.

Akinbola has had solo exhibitions at Sean Kelly, New York; Night Gallery, Los Angeles; Galerie Krinzinger, Vienna; Carbon 12, Dubai; John Kohler Art Center, Sheboygan; the Queens Museum, New York, and other galleries and institutions. His work has been featured in group shows at the Guggenheim, New York, NY; Hauser & Wirth, New York and Los Angeles; Pace Gallery, New York; and the Bernard A. Zuckerman Museum of Art, Kennesaw, among others. Akinbola's work is included in the permanent collections of the Detroit Institute of Arts, Detroit, MI; The Beth Rudin DeWoody Collection; The Everson Museum of Art, Syracuse, NY; Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, New York, NY; Ogunquit Museum of American Art, Ogunquit, ME; Pizzuti Collection, Columbus, OH; and Zabludowicz Collection, London, United Kingdom.
